PROGRESS REPORT 2017

What has Seeds to the World been up to?

Seeds to the World has been busy collecting seed and toys and we wanted to take the time to provide an update on our progress over the last year:

The global need for seed is greater than ever. As you know, natural disasters have taken a toll this year on many rural parts of the world from Haiti, to Puerto Rico, to Jamaica and across the gulf to the US and Mexico. We are continually responding to issues such as crop failure, food shortages, and other life threatening devastation, and are proud to supply such a basic and all-important resource: Seed.

While seed does not provide immediate hunger relief, it should be noted that it can prove to be revitalizing to a community in many ways. It gives empowerment to community members who produce food through their own hard work; it provides hands on education for the community and perpetuates lifelong learning; it provides a renewable source of nutrition with the proper seed saving techniques employed; and it stabilizes a community by reducing their reliance on outside sources of food.

In the last year we have filled suitcases, loaded over a dozen containers, and have continued connecting our partners with useful items that serve communities in need. We hope that you enjoy following our progress as we continue striving to make a difference!

Our Progress this Year in Numbers:


- ♦ Pounds of seeds shipped: 176,741
- ♦ Number of seed packets delivered: 950,000
- ◆ Total estimated value of donations shipped: \$1,268,534.00
- Pounds of toys delivered through Toys to the World: 21,000
- Of the 176,741 pounds of seeds donated, even if only fifty percent production resulted, that would still be around 147,284 tons of food produced!

With activity and outreach beginning to increase, we expect these number to only improve as the organization evolves. We are in the process of extending involvement across several platforms and can't wait to see what the limitless future will bring.

Educational Outreach

World does to help combat global hunger, while learning first hand the amazing qualities of a seed with hands-on planting activities.

The dates for this year's AgVenture are November 2nd in Manteca, January 17th in Stockton, and



February 27th in Lodi. We are looking forward to getting the next generation educated and interested in seeds and our Seeds to the World mission.

Beyond AgVenture, we are looking to expand the scope of our community outreach through future events, targeted towards both kids and adults.

Seeds to the World is available for educational assemblies, field trips, volunteer projects, and other such related activities. Ask us about our outreach opportunities.

EVERYONE CAN LEND A HAND:

We are always looking for seed donors and organizations to help coordinate donation placements. In addition, all monetary donations go directly towards helping us to reach these goals.

What does it take to feed the world?

In short— lots and lots of help, and Seeds to the World relies on the goodwill and hard work of volunteers and other organizations every step of the way:

Step 1) Acquire seeds and other items to ship. We collect donations from seed producers, other non-profits, companies, and humanitarian programs all over the country.

Step 2) Organize a shipment. We

next put together a shipping container's worth of supplies, including a wide variety of seed types and toys.

Step 3) Find a country in need. We utilize third party organizations specializing in global outreach to find a location where the seeds are most needed.

Step 4) And off they go! Seeds are perfect for shipping long distances since they are light, compact, and

can handle adverse conditions.

Step 5) Arrival and dispersal. The shipment arrives at its final destination and is distributed to the local community. Nothing but seeds and smiles all around!

We are always grateful for and in need of contributing partners to help make Seeds to the World possible. If you or someone you know might be interested in getting involved, don't hesitate to reach out to us. We are always looking to expand our seed-loving family!

What's next for STTW?

We are constantly working on receiving, organizing, and facilitating new shipments.

Our most recent offer being put together includes over 10,000 pounds of spinach seed, 6,000 pounds of lettuce seed, 5,000 pounds of various seed packets, and 3,000 pounds of toys.

This pending donation holds an estimated value of \$481,605.00 in supplies, and will surely bring much joy and production wherever it gets placed.

We have well over 50,000 additional pounds of seed stored in our warehouse, with more donations coming in.

Seeds to the World is in the process of forming more partnerships and finding additional avenues in which to help facilitate our increasing seed demands.
